The following information is provided to assist the reader to understand the accounting statement and/or the Annual Governance Statement

1. Expenditure under S137 Local Government Act 1972 and S2 Local Government Act 2000

Section 137(1) of the 1972 Act permits the Council to spend on activities for which it has no other specific powers if the Council considers that the expenditure is in the interests of, and will bring direct benefit to, the area or any part of it, or all or some of its inhabitants, providing that the benefit is commensurate with the expenditure. Section 137(3) also permits the Council to incur expenditure for certain charitable and other purposes. The maximum expenditure that can be incurred under both section 137(1) and (3) for the financial year 2022-23 was £8.82 per elector.

In 2022-23, the Council made payments totalling £0.00 under section 137. These payments are included within 'Other payments' in the Accounting Statement.

2. The External Audit Reports for 2017-2018, 2018-2019 & 2019-2020 were received on 17th March 2023 and the Council have noted the findings and have tried to put into place as many of the recommendations made as possible in readiness for the 2022-2023 Annual Return. The External Audit Report for 2021-2022 was received on 22nd May 2023 by which time the 2022-2023 had been prepared and had been delivered to the Council's Internal Auditor (Mark Evans). Mark was made aware of all of the contents of the External Audit Reports for 2017 through to 2022.

The Council have again noted the recommendations etc. in the 2021-2022 Report and have started to put into place these recommendations and the recommendations contained in Mark's Report for 2022-2023, received on 1st June 2023.

Please note that the Council, in the meeting held on 13th April 2023, Minute 120/22(a), resolved to set up a Finance & Audit Committee (this was set up at the 2023 Annual General Meeting, held on 18th May 2023, Minute AGM05/23) in response to points made in the above-mentioned External Audit Reports. However, this Committee was not in place in time to monitor the 2022-2023 Annual Return.





Auditor General's report and audit opinion

I certify that I have completed the audit of the Annual Return for the year ended 31 March 2023 of **Blaengwrach Community Council**. My audit has been conducted on behalf of the Auditor General for Wales and in accordance with the requirements of the Public Audit (Wales) Act 2004 (the 2004 Act) and guidance issued by the Auditor General for Wales.

Audit opinion: Unqualified

On the basis of my audit, in my opinion no matters have come to my attention to give cause for concern that, in any material respect, the information reported in this Annual Return:

- has not been prepared in accordance with proper practices;
- that relevant legislative and regulatory requirements have not been met;
- is not consistent with the Council's governance arrangements; and
- that the Council does not have proper arrangements in place to secure economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources.


Other matters and recommendations

I draw the Council's attention to the following matters and recommendations which do not affect my audit opinion but should be addressed by the Council.

Restatement of accounts

The 2021-22 comparative accounts have been restated from those reported in the 2021-22 annual return. This is due to the Council changing its accounting basis from and accruals to a receipts and payments basis. The Council should have marked the comparative accounts as 'Restated' to highlight the change. As this is not expected to recur, we do not make any recommendation to the Council.
